Erin is also a member of <u>Next Level Leaders</u>, a two-year Leadership Development Academy dedicated to preparing leaders to conquer complex challenges and thrive in their role.

The AWSP President's Award was presented to Erin on May 14 at ESD 112 by AWSP President Woody Howard and AWSP Deputy Director Jack Arend.
