- 3. As of June 4, 2025, the WSPEF total cash on hand is \$1,943,975 with 16 months of cash on hand. The total AWSL/Learning Centers cash on hand is \$2,592,715. Total expenses of \$1,261,029 and total revenue of \$951,802 for a net income of \$309,227.
- 4. Outdoor Schools WA cash balance as of June 25, 2025, was \$13,189,175 (before last contract payment of \$3.53M) before payments go out to school districts, pending reimbursements.
